Voter Toolkit for State of Georgia

Voters' Bill of Rights AVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE in the election, if you are in line by 7p.m. Polling pla

- \bigstar YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE in the election, if you are in line by 7p.m. Polling places are opens from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Election Day.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE EVEN IF YOU DO NOT HAVE IDENTIFICATION with you on Election Day. If you do not have any form of identification, you must sign a form under oath swearing or affirming that you are the person identified on your voter certificate.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE BY PROVISIONAL BALLOT, even if you are a first time voter who registered by mail and you do not have identification or you did not include a copy of your identification with your application.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO RECEIVE ASSISTANCE, if you cannot read English, you are blind, or disabled, from anyone you choose except your employer, your employer's agent, or an officer or representative of your union. This rule only applies if a federal candidate is on the ballot.
- ★ IF YOU ARE 75 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER, OR YOU ARE DISABLED AND REQUIRE ASSISTANCE IN VOTTING, YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO ASSISTANCE between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Election Day, without waiting in line.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE IN YOUR OLD PRECINCT, if you move to a different county or city after the fifth Monday before Election Day.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO RECEIVE A REPLACEMENT BALLOT, if you make a mistake or "spoil" your ballot and have not cast your ballot by returning the spoiled ballot to a poll officer.
- ★ NO PERSON MAY CAMPAIGN, TRY TO INFLUENCE YOUR VOTE, ASK YOU TO SIGN A PETITION, OR SOLICIT YOU IN ANY WAY when you are standing in line within 25 feet of a polling place.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE WITH A CONVICTION ON YOUR RECORD, if you have completed your sentence, including any period or probation or parole, and have registered to vote since that time.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO BRING YOUR CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF 18 INTO THE VOTING BOOTH as long as they are not disruptive or interfere with the voting process or operate the voting machine.
- ★ YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE DURING THE WORK DAY, as long as you give notice, you have up to two hours to vote, unless you begin work after 9:00 a.m. or end work at 5:00 p.m.

OPPORTUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT (OSD):

If approved by the Georgia electorate in November, the OSD would take over supervision, management in approved by the decorption execution in the amount in the Construction of failing schools. Schools that earn an "F" for three (3) consecutive years according to the state's accountability system are eligible for the new district. This statewide district would be managed by a superintendent appointed and supervised by Georgia's governor and could take control of up to 20 schools per year up to a maximum of 100 at a time
