Membership Development through Hands-on, Interactive Engagement

ULGA-YP members go through three phases to ensure they are connected, comfortable, and confident in their knowledge of the Urban League **Orientation** – Launched new member orientation program drawing 111 members with a 44% participation rate increase over last year.

YPeer Program – assist the organization in promoting the development and engagement of new YP members by providing one on one interactive relationship that serve to connect new members to the organization.

YP Ambassador – designed to train members to serve as representatives for ULGA-YP to the Atlanta community at large. YP Ambassadors play an integral role in advancing ULGA-YP's mission, increasing the visibility of ULGA-YP across the metro Atlanta region, and recruiting new members to the organization.

When the events are planned, work is done, and lives are changed the people must know. Our communications team spreads the good word of ULGA-YP via several channels.











Shalondan served as membership chair from 2015-2017 and is a large contributor to the growth of the organization in the 2016-2017 year.
