Each member of the ELT took the StrengthsFinder test, and during the workshop, received the StrengthsFinder book and discussed their results as a team.

This year's retreats included lessons on leadership taught by our National Urban League Young Professional (NULYP) Executive Vice President Charis Goff. The new ELT also took professional headshots, learned how to build a budget, set SMART goals and created a comprehensive plan for the year

CANDIDATE BOOTCAMP

The bootcamp reviewed the election process and expectations. In addition, it provided an overview of the responsibilities of the Executive Leadership team to help prepare them for their new role as leaders in the organization.

CONFERENCE

Members had the opportunity to attend various leadership development conferences this year, including the National Urban League (NUL) Annual and Legislative Policy conferences where they learned about issues impacting our community, received personal and professional development and interacted with community and corporate leaders.

A Legacy of Leadership

This year, with a focus on leadership development, ULGA-YP expanded beyond its monthly general body programs and hosted several workshops and virtual sessions to continue the legacy of creating the next generation of corporate, civic and social leaders within our community.

BREAKING THE GLASS CEILING

In celebration of Women's History Month, the ULGA-YP presented Breaking the Glass Ceiling, a web series about women in leadership. With **84** participants, this series - four sessions during one week - featured four powerful women discussing various topics including advocating for women in the workplace and movement of women in leadership.

YP L.E.A.D SUMMIT

YP L.E.A.D (Leadership, Entrepreneurship, Advocacy & Development) is a three-day summit that aims to empower young people to create positive change by connecting them with business leaders, policymakers and most importantly each other. This year, ULGA-YP had **19** members participate in the L.E.A.D conference held in Columbus, Ohio.

ILEAD CONFERENCE

As part of its initiative to attract and support collegiate students, ULGA-YP members were invited to participate as speakers at the iLead Conference at Clark Atlanta University. The conference featured presentations and workshops focusing on the soft skills of leadership from key Student Government Association leaders, strategic administration leaders and community leaders. The attendees selected this year included more than **50** student leaders who served as executive board members within their organizations. ULGA-YP's panel focused on ways to gain leadership experience through volunteering and community service..

LEVEL UP SERIES: INCREASING YOUR NET WORTH

In partnership with The Piedmont Group of Atlanta, LLC, ULGA-YP held a four-part, members-only, financial series covering topics including personal finance basics, managing debt and credit and Investing 2.0. The series, which had 94 attendees, also offered a virtual workshop on retirement and allowed participants to engage in a Black Wealth Roundtable discussion to develop strategies for building black wealth within urban communities. The final stage of the series included offering the participants a free one-on-one financial consultation.

MENTAL HEALTH & THE YOUNG PROFESSIONAL

With more than **70** young professionals in attendance, this panel discussion and presentation focused on navigating mental health disparities as a young professional in Atlanta. This included toxic masculinity, work-life balance, and the importance of mental health. The panelists included Psychology Professor Dr. Ayanna Cummings, ULGA-YP President Emeritus Ciji Townsend, and Founder and CEO of Holistic Atlanta, Vaugn N. Gay.

HOME OWNERSHIP 101

With **371** views, this YP University Facebook Live chat led by Tawny Powell, manager of Homebuyer Education and Counseling for Committed to Communities, highlighted the important steps and resources needed to start the process of owning your first home.

SECURE THE BAG: BUILDING BLACK WEALTH

This event focused on financial security and wealth building. With more than **70** participants, the panel discussion included special guest J. Alexander Martin, co-founder of FUBU and author of Money Makes Me Crazy: How I Squandered Millions of Dollars Building the FUBU Empire.

With more than 600 views, this Facebook live event was led by founder and Chief Creative Office of Creative Juice, Octavia Warren Gilmore. Gilmore educated viewers on transitioning to entrepreneurship.

SUPER SATURDAY HOMEBUYER EDUCATION WORKSHOP & RESOURCE FAIR

With more than 150 attendees, this ULGA Homebuyer Education Workshop and Resource Fair provided an avenue for attendees to finally kick their fears of the homebuying process to the curb by connecting them with financial and housing experts including mortgage lenders, HUD-approved housing counseling agencies and down payment assistance specialists. ULGA-YP and ULGA Guild members supported the Affiliate program as both speakers and volunteers.

THE BIG PITCH

This year, ULGA-YP hosted a pitch competition to not only increase the community's exposure to small minority owned businesses in the local area but also to financially support the advancement of these businesses. Ultimately, six startups were invited to Kat's Cafe, a local black-owned business, to pitch their business to six renowned judges and an audience of 75 community leaders and young professionals for a cash prize."











A Legacy of Advocacy

ULGA-YP engaged in the NULYP BOUNCE BACK initiative by registering voters, engaging in letter writing, hosting educational forums and encouraging members and the community to vote. Through our efforts, ULGA-YP reached more than 400 individuals through our voter education programs, advocacy initiatives and campaigns.

ENOUGH IS ENOUGH VOTE

ULGA-YP joined NULYP at Morehouse College for the Enough Is Enough Vote campaign where attendees to the annual Spelhouse Homecoming were reminded to take advantage of early voting. ULGA-YP also participated in the Enough is Enough Vote social media campaign and sent text messages to more than **275** members encouraging them to register and reminding them to vote.

JUSTICE DAY AT THE CAPITOL

YP joined forces with ULGA and its coalition partners to participate in Justice Day at the Capitol with hundreds of attendees. The event included speakers, bill review sessions and opportunities to speak to representatives and senators.

THE STATE OF YOUNG ATL

ULGA-YP hosted its second annual State of Young ATL event. With more than **70** participants, we were joined by Andre Dickens, Post 3 At- Large, Atlanta City Council and Chenee Joseph, Executive Director, Historic District Development Corporation to share their perspectives in a TED-style format on the topics of Advocacy, Transportation, and Livability

BEYOND THE BALLOT

Beyond the Ballot was an advocacy-training opportunity that walked young professionals through the state legislative process, provided a glimpse into the political landscape of a growing city and prepared young professionals to be effective advocates. Speakers included Christopher Bruce, Legislative Director, ACLU of Georgia, Justin Kirnon, Government Relations Manager, MARTA, Meredith Lilly, Director of External Affairs, Dekalb County, Matt Westmoreland, Post 2-At Large, Atlanta City Council and Aisha Yaqoob, Policy Director, Asian Americans Advancing Justice

ADVOCACY LETTERS

YPs joined in on the NUL call to action to contact our representatives to pass the Voting Rights Advancement Act, which would ensure fair access to the ballot for all Americans.

SUPER SATURDAY

With more than 100 participants, this voter education event provided young professionals the opportunity to register to vote, connect with elected officials and engage in interactive activities that educated them on the political climate and prepared them for the November election.

LEGISLATIVE POLICY CONFERENCE

Young professionals gathered with affiliate CEOs and Guild members in our nation's capital for three days of intensive advocacy and policy training, challenging conversations about the state of our urban cities with elected officials, and unique networking opportunities.

CIVIC DINNERS

In preparation for the November election, ULGA-YP hosted a civic dinner for members to discuss various topics that ranged from items on the upcoming ballot, engaging the community in the election process and advocacy at the local level.







MONTHLY-GIVE PROGRAM


